Ajanta as a Composite Region: Its History, Heritage and Environment

Concept Note

Ajanta well known for its Buddhist cave architecture encompasses in its background valuable cultural and environmental heritage. Ajanta name given to the Buddhist Caves is after the hill ranges of Ajanta which is spread over Jalna, Buldhana and Aurangabad districts of present Maharashtra State. The Ajanta hill ranges are covered with the forest and wildlife sanctuary of Gautala and river drainage areas of Waghor, Pein and Wein Ganga. In this region we have diverse ethnic communities of Bhil, Mahadeo Koli, Banjara, Vanjara etc. and migratory populations of Rajputs, Bundela, Yemeni-Hadrami, Arab-Chaus and so on. Historically when we assess this geographic region it fell on a major trade route from Agra-Ujjain-Burhanpur and connected it with the Deccan and South India. Since the ancient times hills and human passages of Ajanta remained cultural bridge between north and south. The active human and commodity migration on this path of cultural-convergence led in the development of the trading towns of Ajanta, Sillod, Bhokardhan, Jalna, Deogiri connecting it to the cities of Aurangabad and Pratishthan these trade passages were constructed various Buddhist, Jain, Hindu and Islamic structures in form of caves, temples, mosques and sarai respectively. These places of worship and habitation were patronized and embellished with the human and natural resources available from the neighbouring regions. However, the resource rich geographic region of Ajanta over the times has shown severe decline in its resource spread and ecological changes are evident in drying up of the water bodies and diminishing biodiversity resources which once enriched natural and cultural heritage of Ajanta. The seminar will discuss various issues pertaining to the heritage and ecology of 'Ajanta' as a sub-region of Aurangabad region. Aurangabad history Society through this seminar therefore, intends to bring out the newer aspects of region s connected and linked to the AHS.
